

# Confirmation Dress Code

- Confirmation is a Sacrament that is celebrated with much reverence, joy, and dignity. The attire worn by both the Confirmation Candidate and his/her Sponsor should reflect the same.
- Attire during the Confirmation Mass, for both candidates and sponsors, should be Christmas or Easter best, respecting Christian modesty and Church tradition. Traditionally, this has been as follows:

## What should candidates wear for Confirmation?

| Women  | Men   |
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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Dress or Skirt and Blouse</li></ul> <p><i>Dresses and skirts must be <b>BELOW</b> the knee. Dresses and blouses are to have a modest neckline; back and shoulders <b>MUST</b> be covered.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Dress Shoes (You should be able to walk comfortably)</li></ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Navy or Black Dress Pants<br/>(No jeans or cargo pants)</li><li>• White Long-Sleeve Dress Shirt</li><li>• Solid Dress Tie</li><li>• Suit Jacket (Optional)</li><li>• Dress Socks and Dress Shoes<br/>(No gym shoes)</li></ul> |

***Please be sure your forehead is uncovered (free from hair or hair accessories) for anointing from the bishop.***
